A FOLLOW UP TO VERBAL BEHAVIOR TRAINING 3 DAY BOOTCAMP

DESCRIPTION

Many learners on the autism spectrum demonstrate significant skill deficits in the areas of language, imitation and play/social skills. Quite often these students also lack social approach behaviors, which are critical to the successful use of other instructional practices. This training will cover the teaching protocols for establishing early skills in these types of learners. Procedures for establishing instructional control and protocols for teaching initial mands, beginning imitation skills, listener responding, and establishing foundational social interaction skills will be covered. Behavioral protocols and data-based decision-making systems will also be covered. Training strategies will include written pre/post tests, guided notes, hands-on practice, and individual skill competency checks.
