



ABC Data Collection

DEFINITION

ABC data collection is an assessment tool used to gather information that should evolve into a behavior implementation plan.

TYPES/PURPOSE

ABC is critical to your FBA! Analyzing the contingency between antecedent, behavior and consequences will provide your team with great information for how to manipulate the environment and common trends with antecedents and how we respond to behavior (consequences).

WHAT DOES ABC STAND FOR?

DO YOU KNOW YOUR ABC'S?

A

ANTICIPED

What event, directive, motivating operation, or action happens RIGHT before a behavior occurs.

B

BEHAVIOR

the exact observable thing a person did or skill you want them to do.

C

CONSEQUENCE

What action or response immediately followed the behavior. Could be something in the environment or could be mediated by another person.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF ABC FORMS

There are many ways to utilize ABC tracking including anecdotal, checklists, google forms.

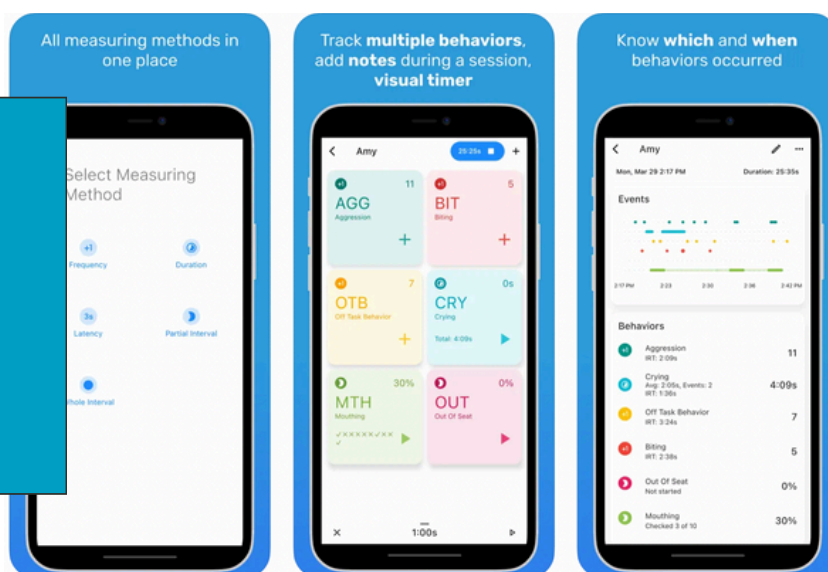

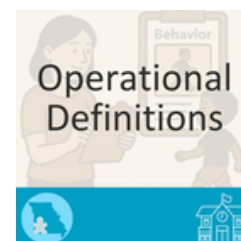
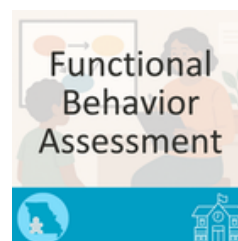
REMINDERS
