The Autism Program Environment Rating Scale (APERS) is an assessment tool used to evaluate the quality of educational environments and programs for students with autism.

## WHAT DOES IT MEASURE?

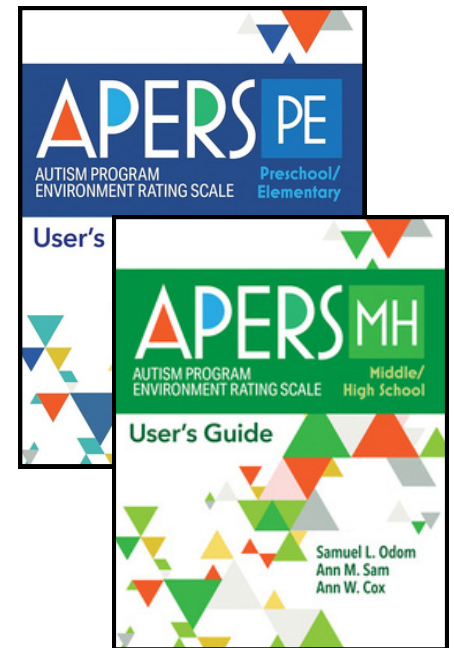
It measures various aspects of the educational setting, including physical environment, curriculum and instruction, communication, social and emotional development, and staff/student interactions.

## WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

The APERS helps identify strengths and areas for improvement, guiding educators in creating supportive, effective, and inclusive learning environments for autistic students.
