- Appropriate Student Preferences






# TAKING BREAKS APPROPRIATELY

- Good Leisure skill activities need:
  - To be age appropriate
  - Goal oriented
  - Student preferred
  - Can be accessed in multiple environments
    - Parks, Social gatherings, home, ect.
- Use practical materials that can be easily accessed and replaceable.
- Start Small
  - Work up to longer time limits

- Outside
- Specified classroom living room type area
- Each student has different interests and preferences
- Options for independent and shared group activities




### REMINDERS
