TAKING BREAKS APPROPRIATELY

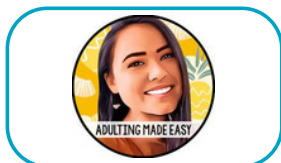
- We can't have a student engage in an activity in a non-functional way and call it leisure.
- Good Leisure skill activities need:
 - To be age appropriate
 - Goal oriented
 - Student preferred
 - Can be accessed in multiple environments
 - Parks, Social gatherings, home, ect.
- Use practical materials that can be easily accessed and replaceable.
- Start Small
 - Work up to longer time limits
